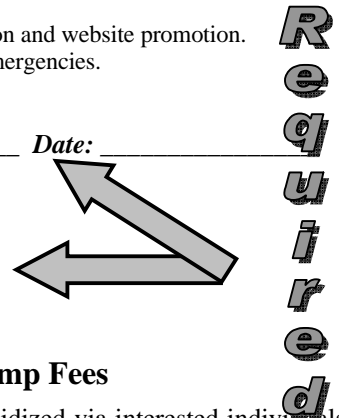

Day Camp Overview

After the bus ride, camp begins with the campers gathering for attendance check, announcements and counselor initiated activities. Through the day the campers enjoy varied, age appropriate activities, that include Bible lessons, singing, games, team competitions, swimming and water activities, free time and their chosen activity. Each day the children have one free period to be involved in an activity of interest to them. This chosen activity lasts for one week, except for swimming lessons, which is a two-week course and Junior Variety which is for two weeks.

Junior campers: age 7, 8 and 9.

Senior campers: age 10 and 11.

Twelve and Teen (TnT): age 12– 14.

We suggest that campers will be most comfortable in inexpensive shorts and t-shirts. Other clothes, appropriate for the expected weather of the day, can be worn or stored in a backpack that each camper should bring to hold personal belongings. There is a place to store this at camp. Everyone should bring a bathing suit and towel every day, as there are often “wet activities” to participate in. Sunscreen and a hat are advised. As well campers should bring a sweater or rain resistant jacket when needed.

Please label everything your child brings or wears to camp. Lost items can easily be identified if clearly labeled. We suggest campers do not bring expensive clothes, toys or games to camp.

Campers must bring a lunch for their noon meal. The camp provides a drinking box or water at noon and tuck in the afternoon. This is included in the camp fee so children do not need to bring money to camp.

Buses should leave camp at 4:30pm and children will be dropped off at approximately the time indicated. It may take a day or two to establish the bus route and routine.

There is a special camp closing program on the last Friday evening of a camp session. This includes singing, a skit, counselor introductions and a video review.

Important Notices

1. Camp is for children who have been enrolled in grades one to eight this year, and were born in the years 1996 to 2003.
2. **Because of severe nut allergies we desire to have a nut and peanut free environment. Do not send lunch items with nuts, nut products, peanuts, peanut butter or peanut products.**
3. Parents are responsible to see their children to and from the bus. Children misbehaving on the bus may be denied bus access.
4. All medications your child needs to take while at camp must be handed in to camp staff.
5. If children are going to leave camp early we must be notified in advance. Children may not leave the camp without our knowledge.
6. Children will be placed in groupings according to their age on December 31ST.
7. Camp session 1 will start on Mon. July 5.
Camp session 3 will not have camp Monday, Aug. 2.
8. Due to limited space, early registration is necessary. No registering or reservations are taken by phone.

Free Period Activity Choice Information

- ✓ The free period activity is a 45-minute activity chosen by the camper. One activity for each week will be assigned except for swimming and junior variety which are two-week programs.
- ✓ Enrolment in some activities is limited therefore more than first and second choices must be indicated. If a desired activity is full the next available preference will be given. If 3rd and 4th choices are not indicated on the form, we will assign activities where there is space.
- ✓ Activity selections will be honored on a first come first served basis.
- ✓ Only one water sport activity will be given to twelve and teen campers (TnT).

Free Period Activity Choice Information Continued

- ✓ The lake activities (*) require swimming proficiency. A camper will need to pass a swimming test in the pool before being able to participate in lake activities.
- ✓ The youngest age group (7, 8 & 9) chooses either swimming lessons or Junior Variety that could include games, crafts, rowboats, sports, etc.
- ✓ The swimming lessons choice is a two-week activity.

- ✓ Full payment sent with registration is appreciated. A minimum payment of \$50 is due immediately. All final payments are due by May 31st.
- ✓ A camp registration confirmation and invoice will be sent after registration has been entered.
